
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Program Overview



The Gender Unicorn




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

Gender

- Gender Identity: A person's internal, deeply felt knowledge of being male, female, something else, or something inbetween.
- Transgender: An "umbrella" term describing a person whose gender identity does not match their sex assigned at birth.
- Cisgender: Also known as cis. Someone who is not trans and whose gender identity matches their sex assigned at birth.



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Sexual Orientation vs Gender Identity

- •Sexual Orientation: refers to an individual's enduring pattern of physical, romantic, emotional and/or spiritual attraction toward other people.
- •You can only know a person's sexual orientation or gender identity if they tell you.

What is the Gender Binary?

This is the concept or belief that there are only two "**genders**," male and female.

This concept implies that these two genders align with a person's biological sex and that their gender identity, expression, and sexuality will all line up with one another

What's Wrong with the Gender Binary?





The gender binary perpetuates heteronormativity and cissexism.



Race, gender expression, gender identity, and socioeconomic status are some things that impact a transgender person's access to healthcare.

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What can be traumatizing?

Any exam or procedure could be potentially traumatic for transgender and non-binary patients

- Create a culture of consent with patients
- Ask first before touching
- Go slow and stop immediately if requested by the patient
- Avoid gendered language
- Explain what you are doing and why you are doing it
- Ask the patient if they'd like to have a loved one or safe person present if an exam is needed



Microaggressions

"Microaggressions are the everyday verbal, nonverbal, and environmental slights, snubs, or insults, *whether intentional or unintentional*, that communicate hostile, derogatory, or negative messages to target persons based solely upon their marginalized group membership"



Creating a Safe Space













Be inclusive

- Be aware of assumptions or biases
- Try not to assume everyone is heterosexual, cis-gender or anatomically "typical". Be open to differences.
- Use gender neutral language on intake forms and when taking a social or sexual history
- Ask open ended questions
 - Who lives at home with you?
 - Are you in a relationship?
- Use language you are asked to use
 - chosen name
 - "Preferred" pronoun
 - labels for patient or partner
- If you make a mistake, apologize and continue providing your excellent care

Trans Inclusive Language

Instead of

- They are transgendered
- The transgenders
- My friend is a transgender
- They are transgendering

Try

- They are transgender
- The transgender community
- My friend is transgender
- They are transitioning

Other terms to outright avoid saying/using: Transsexual, Tranny, He/She, Tranvestite, She-Male, It, Transgenderism

Instead of:

Assuming	person uses legal name
Assuming	a person's pronouns
Using	gendered language to refer to people
Having	forms with gendered language or only male/female options available

Consider:

- I see your legal name is XX, is there a different name you go by?
- Hello, my name is Brit and my pronouns are they/them. What are your pronouns?
- Consider other ways to address groups of people. "Hello Friends"
- Updating forms to have additional options for legal sex, gender identity, and pronouns.

Affirmed Name and Pronouns

- Previously referred to as "preferred" name and pronouns
- Pronouns: Gender pronouns used to refer to someone in place of their name
- Affirmed name: A name that is used in place of their legal name
 - Do not refer to a person's legal name as their "real" name



Gender Neutral Pronouns

- Pronouns that can be used in place of more gendered pronouns like he/him or she/her
- They/Them/Theirs are common gender neutral pronouns but they are not the only ones!

Did you know that using they/them for a singular person can be traced as far back as the 1300s? Writers such as Shakespeare and Jane Austen used *they* to refer to one person

The pronoun list on the reverse is not an exhaustive list. It is good practice to ask which pronouns a person uses.

Possessive Pronoun: The pronoun card is theirs.

Reflexive: They think highly of themself.

LGBTQ Advocacy in Healthcare

- Create a gender-affirming environment
- Partner with providers for immediate & preventive health needs
- Become familiar with gender inclusive language
- Find transgender inclusive HIV education and prevention materials for PrEP & PEP
- Understand Hormone Replacement Therapy side effects
- Help patients understand health insurance issues
- Referrals to gender affirming providers or other resources
- Ask patients how they would like to be referred to. Ask if they'd like that information to be added to their record.

KEY TAKE HOME POINTS

Sex, Gender, Sexuality:

Three separate concepts as they relate to biology, expression, and attraction. These concepts are far from being binary.

"Ally" is a verb:

<u>Demonstrate</u> allyship to your LGBTQIA+ friends and loved ones. This is ongoing and sometimes uncomfortable. However, it is life-saving and life-changing.

Learning takes time:
